## Legislation

In 2021, British Columbia becartine fifth province in Canada to introduce accessibility legislatione. Act provides a framework to identify, remove, and prevent barriers to accessibility. It is an important step to making BC. a more accessible and truly inclusive province for all people with disabilities.

Earlier last year, the provincial government announced that all publicly funded postdary institutions



support them. It is recognized that there are diverse and evolving ways to deliver educational and learner support services. Thus, we expect to see innovative proposals informed by the scholarship of teaching and learning or by effective pedagogical practices.

Principle C: Flexibility

UFV's campuses will reflect the ability to adapt to multiple uses, reconfigure spaces, and respond to changing program and service needs.

Principle D: Sustainability

UFV's campuses will reflect the ability to adapt to multiple uses in the spaces, and respond to changing program and service needs.
