




ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

MINIMUM OF A BACHELOR'S DEGREE

Applicants must complete an undergraduate degree (Child and Youth Care, Education, Psychology, Social Work, or other allied degree) from a recognized posteondary institution with a minimum GPA of 3.00 (B average).

PRIOR OURSEWORK

Applicants must have either graduated from an A6bbBorsed degree program or the successfully completed specific prerequisite courses (listed below) as outlined on the ACLP website (hildlife.org) as part of their previous degree. Prerequisite academicurses include:

- Minimum of two Child Development courses
- Family Systems course
- Research course

EXPERIENCE


Experience working with children or youth (paid work or practicum) must be a minimum of 600 hours. Students must have completed at least 100 volunteer hours with children or youth in a hospital or **healthe**d setting.


STATEMENT OF INTENT
