- It wasstressed that the faculty and students that create products do so for the passion of the research, not just conomic gain as there is very little for them at the university level and because of all the coststeps to get the product to market

SCOPE

Primary institutional responsibility for reviewing research involving humans at UFV rests with the UFV Human Research Ethics Board (HREB) ainddudly with the researchers themselves. This Policy applies to research involving human participants:

- 1) That is conducted by all faculty members, staff, students, and all other research personnel associated with UF,\(\frac{1}{2}\)
- 2) That is undertaken under the auspicesoofin affiliation with the University of the Fraser Valley; or
- 3) That uses University of the Fraser Valley equipment, facilitiesce, or resources.

This policy is in compliance with the-**D**ouncil Policy Statemeon Ethical Conduct for Research Involving Human (2014). The policies on conflict of interest and responsible conduct of research and scholarship are also applicable.

POLICY

All research that involves living human participants requires review and approxaHuman Research Ethics Board (HRE) designated department research ethics committee (DRE) cordance with this policy and the T-Council Policy Statement Edition (TCPS 2) 'Ethical Conduct for Research Involving Humans', before the research is started.

UFV expects all researchers to adhere to the principles described herein.

The following core principles are outlined in the Tri Council Policy State (R). These are principles that UFV will follow. The three core principles are: respect for persons, concern for w and justice.

x Respect for persons refers to the recognition of the intrinsic value of human beings and the respect and consideration due to them as human participants. Autonomy is a consideration when considering respects for persons

- x Concern for welfare takes into account the quality of the person's experiences. This incluthe impact on their physical, mental, aspiritual health, and their physical, economical circumstances.
- x Justice refers to fairness and equitable treatment. No specific populations should be burdened as specific recipients of the harms in research, or denied the benefits of researchs exarchs knowledge.
