- o A project examined the impact of court rulings on police investigation time and resources. The Jordan Project which looked at the time between when a person is convicted compared to when they are charged the Jordan Project is a law that now states the time between a conviction to a first appearance in court, can take no longer than 18 months, and 30 months for Supreme Court cases. This has put strain on investigators to have all evidence in place prior to the time restrictions. The project brought attention to the issues and complexities courts are facing and the dangers it poses to the community.
