POLICY

An æademic programeview is the administrative process that provides a systematic quantitative and qualitative review of the objectives and delivery of programs and programming.

Academic program reviews will:

- x foster ongoing improvement of their quality;
- x enhancetheir contribution to the university's strategic goals, vision, missiden, sand values;
- x alignwith Institutional Learning Outcomes;
- x achieve and maintainigh standards of educational practices;
- x achieve and maintaihigh professional standards, as **ogn**ized by the disciplinary and/or accrediting bodies; and
- x ensure an adequate and effective utilization of resources.

All academic programs and programminity normally undergo a review every seven to eigetars, or at any time if it is requested by the Dean or Provost and-Priesident, Academic.

Academic program reviews shall be carried out under the general supervision of the Dean responsible for the program and the Provost and Viewsident, Academic.

At the discretion of the Provost and ViPresident, Academic, the accreditation of professional school(s) or program(s) may serve as a component of an academic program review.

The results of an academic program review are communicated to the university ext thangugh the Senate and its committees, as relevant to these committees' respective responsibilities due consideration given to confidential information summary of the review is made publicly available.

REGULATIONS

The review of programs or ogramming will inclde the relevant academic units at are responsible for, or contribute to, their delivery.

The main elements of the review process are:

- 1 A scope letter;
- 2 A selfassessmenof the program or programming by the unit(s) delivering thregram;
- 3 A site visit and assessment report by the review committee;
- 4 A report and action plan prepared by the unit(s) and the Dean in response to the review within three months of receipt of the review report;
- 5 A summary of the review for public distribiont; and
- 6 A progress report on the action plan submitted by the Dean to the Provost with 1/20 on the of the review.

The order in which programs and programming are reviewed will be determined by the Provost and VicePresident, Academic in consultationith the Deans of the respective Faculties/College, and will form part of an institutional multiyear program review plan. Under exceptional circumstances, a Dean may request a review of a particular program or programming.
